

## Resource Corner 6-7-10

Well we are off and running. There are a lot of things going on in the field, hopefully you are getting your spraying needs taken care of. There are several products out there that can be tank mixed with Glyphosate, in corn, that will provide you with some better broadleaf control, as well as provide you with some residual activity. Some weeds are becoming rather difficult to control, but there are solutions. The other positive point to using one of these products is that you are breaking up the chain of using Glyphosate year after year. Using a different mode of action is a good practice so we don't build up resistance in these Glyphosate resistant crops.

Another issue that will soon be rapidly approaching is your fall GPS soil sampling. When wheat harvest is over it is time to get your fields sampled. Make sure that you have a plan set up with your agronomist as far as what fields need to be sampled. If you are considering sampling fields for the first time, or are a little skeptical of GPS soil sampling, get a hold of your agronomist and they can run some figures with you. There are numerous example of how GPS soil sampling has paid for itself. Putting your fertilizer where you need it is a very economical way to spread your inputs. The COOP has top of the line equipment, and samples every 2.5 acres. There are many different types of soil sampling out there so make sure you are getting the most for your money.
